Panelist Biographies

John Sardelis (moderator)

Dr. John Sardelis is a Professor of Health Care Administration and Health Care Management at St. Joseph’s College, New York. He is a Member of the American Academy of Actuaries, an Associate of the Society of Actuaries, and a Fellow of New York Academy of Medicine. His professional and scholarly interests include health care advocacy, health care literacy, data analytics and the use of information technology to lower costs.

Sardelis holds, a Master of Science in Statistics and Operations Research from New York University, Stern School of Business, and a Doctorate of Public Health from Columbia University, Mailman School of Public Health.

John serves on several health care boards including Affinity Health, IPRO and Partners Health Plan.

Maria Basile, MD, MBA (panelist)

Dr. Maria Basile is a colorectal surgeon who recently left private practice to pursue interests in Healthcare Policy and Administration. She is on the Core Faculty at Stony Brook University School of Medicine’s Center for Medical Humanities, Compassionate Care and Bioethics (www.stonybrook.edu/bioethics), where she teaches medical school and graduate-level courses in Literature and Medicine. She is author of *Minimally Invasive: poems from a life in surgery*.

In 2012, Dr. Basile was appointed Assistant Vice President of Medical Affairs at John T. Mather Memorial Hospital, where her responsibilities include professional credentialing, physician engagement, hospital quality improvement, and leadership development. Dr. Basile is Immediate Past President of the Suffolk County Medical Society. She serves on the NY State Workgroup on Value-Based



Healthcare and the Clinical Quality Committee of the Suffolk Care Collaborative. She lives in East Setauket with her husband, their two children, and her father, a retired general surgeon.

Joe Shulman is the executive director of North Shore-LIJ Care Solutions Mr. Schulman oversees North Shore-LIJ’s care management business strategy and is responsible for the internal capabilities of the care management organization.
